Safeguarding Our Investment in the Theta Delta Chapter House

As House Corporation President, it has been a rewarding few years as we've restored our beloved Theta Delta Chapter at The Ohio State University and built a new, state-of-the-art Chapter home for the next century. We have an outstanding group of young men in the Chapter who I believe you would all be proud to call "brother." And, I'm humbled by the dedication of our inspiring group of alumni advisors and volunteers that work collectively to ensure smooth operations.

Sophomore Live-in and the New House

Theta Delta is "qualified" for sophomore live-in by The Ohio State University. OSU now requires all freshmen and sophomores to live on campus in residence halls. But OSU also partners with Greek organizations to allow sophomores to live

in their houses. To qualify for sophomore live-in, the facility must meet certain criteria—which are mostly related to meeting safety and ADA standards. Since we have a brand-new house and we incorporated all minimum standards into our structure, we are qualified. This is an ongoing process and we must be certified every year.

The sophomore live-in qualification has stimulated a lot of construction on the Ohio State campus. We chose to build a brand-new house rather than trying to retrofit the old house to meet new standards and expectations, which would have been nearly impossible. Some, such as Delta Tau Delta, Kappa Kappa Gamma, and Delta Gamma, have added major additions; others, such as Zeta Tau Alpha and Chi Omega, are also building new houses. Everyone expects there will be more to follow.

When it comes to their Chapter House, the active Chapter members knew it was necessary for them to invest alongside the alumni—to "put their money where their mouth is." Showing their support early-on helped prove to alumni that this Chapter was dedicated to standing strong, recruiting solid new members, and taking this brotherhood to the next level. It was also proof that they wanted to care for this house, just as much as the alumni.

Chapter President **Tommy Weber '20** said of the new house:

"The Theta Delta Chapter was blessed with a brand-new Chapter House in 2017. It is by far the best house on our campus, and I would argue with anybody that it is the nicest Chapter House in the country. We realize the house would not have been possible without our alumni, and we felt like we should have our part in the payment for the Chapter House as well. That is why our Chapter pledged \$40,000 to help cover the cost of the house."

The entire Chapter is committed to doing their part to keep the house nice and ensuring that alumni who come back to visit have an enjoyable experience.

Tommy says, "Every time I walk in the house I am thankful for what was gifted to us. And I am speaking for all of the brothers that we very much appreciate everything our alumni have done and continue to do for us."

Safeguarding Our Investment

The new house is a multimillion-dollar investment. It is a showplace and the envy of other fraternities and sororities. To protect the investment made by many loyal alumni, plans were made from the outset to maintain the facility at the highest level possible. A team

SUCCESSES FROM THETA DELTA ALL-AROUND

Chapter Experiences Success in the Classroom, on the Court, and in the Community

The fall 2018 semester was a great one for the Theta Delta Chapter of Beta Theta Pi. To start the semester off, we recruited a strong 14-man pledge class with new members coming from all over the United States. All 14 pledges were initiated and are now making an amazing impact within the Fraternity.

Excellence in Risk Management

During the fall semester, we received an award from the Beta Theta Pi Fraternity for "Excellence in Risk Management." We are very proud of this accomplishment, as it can be incredibly difficult to manage risk within a Chapter of our size.

Soccer and GPA Successes

Our intramural soccer team took home the trophy for the second consecutive year in the all-fraternity division. We are only losing one member of the team, so we will look to make it three years in a row next fall. At the end of the semester, the new executive board was voted in, and we took over the last week of the semester. The new executive board is balanced between four sophomores looking to make an instant impact and five juniors prepared to lead the Chapter. The average GPA for our Chapter from the fall was just below a 3.4, and we are always trying to improve upon that.

28 New Members

After winter break, we immediately resumed recruitment. We're proud to have 28 new members who will be initiated in a few short weeks.

Some highlights from the spring semester so far are winning Tri Delta's annual dodgeball tournament and having a very successful first part of our philanthropy. At our Mom's Weekend, there was a silent auction for gift baskets to benefit the Columbus Star House. Star House is a homeless youth shelter right here in Columbus. The second part of our philanthropy is a concert we have in the parking lot of the house. Our goal is to raise \$15,000 for Star House, and we are on a good track to reaching that goal between our two major fundraising events. The \$15,000 benchmark would exceed last year's philanthropic total by \$2,000.

Beta Basketball Excitement

The Beta intramural basketball team is on fire. The head of the league had to implement a mercy rule because of us! The playoffs are underway, and we are looking to bring home the trophy. In fact, the Theta Delta Chapter is so obsessed with basketball that we now have an inter-Chapter basketball league (called the Beta Basketball League, or BBL for short) that consists of 15 teams and over 60 brothers.

Times have been good for the Theta Delta Chapter, and we're continuing to strive for excellence into the future.

approach was instituted. Key highlights are:

- Fingerprint access for exterior doors and keypad entry into individual rooms.
- Live-in house director reports to the House Corporation.
- Meal service is outsourced to Campus Cooks.
- Facility repair and maintenance is contracted to ARX Realty.
- Eight-member advising team supports the Chapter separate from House Corporation.
- Leases co-signed by parents.
- All lessees pay a \$500 security deposit.
- Theta Delta is a substance-free facility.

Theta Delta is a strong, vibrant Chapter today at OSU. As a leadership team, we are mindful that it is important to reduce the debt on the new house to ensure future financial stability. Yes, we are operating well today, but there will inevitably be hiccups along the way in the future. We may just be "conservative Midwesterners," but as a leadership team we believe the smart thing is to reduce the debt burden. We hope you will agree and join us in supporting the campaign to ensure a stable financial base for the future.
