Spotlight on Dominic Jr. '85 and Dominic III '18 Bagnoli

The traditions of Beta unite us all, whether one of the first initiates, a refounding father, or somewhere in-between. **Dominic Jr. '85** and **Dominic III '18 Bagnoli** are lucky enough to also be united as father and son.

Dominic III always knew he wanted to join Greek life, as both of his parents were involved, but wasn't sure where he belonged. His father asked him to meet with the colony coordinator, **Brock Griffin, Utah '13**, and Dominic soon found he belonged at Beta. "I saw something different in this group of guys. I saw their ambition and shared dream to fix the mistakes of the past and to build a bigger and better Beta."

The father-son duo has enjoyed their shared Beta memories and looks forward to making more. Domininc III notes, "One of the defining moments we had as father and son was when I was initiated in Oxford. My dad surprised me when he helped in the ritual and helped initiate me himself. That meant a lot to me." Dominic Jr. is proud of Dominic III's role in refounding Theta Delta—reestablishing a community he is so proud of.

Dominic Jr. was proud to be a Beta back in college, and still is today. "Our spot on 15th and Indianola just seemed like we were the prime house on campus. Those pillars, that porch: how could you beat it? I learned a lot by getting involved in leadership and self-governance, and some of the friends I made are among my best even today!" His favorite Ohio State memory was Script Ohio, and his favorite Beta traditions were all the history and singing.

The Bagnolis are enthusiastic supporters of Beta and know how important supporting Theta Delta is. Dominic Jr. volunteers his time serving Beta, thanks to the influence of Coach Woody Hayes, who said, "You can never pay back so you must pay forward." Dominic Jr. says, "Beta was very important in my life and I know it can be for so many other young men, I hope I can be an example and encourage others to support Beta." Dominic III is confident in Theta Delta's ability to create Men of Principle. "Beta is a trailblazer nationally. UNDERGRADUATES SHARE WHY THIS CHAPTER WILL BE DIFFERENT

Q&A WITH THREE REFOUNDING FATHERS

Beta Theta Pi is alive and thriving once again on the Ohio State campus. Despite many obstacles to overcome, the new colony is confident that the recolonization will be a success. We understand that alumni may have reservations about the Chapter's return, but the alumni board believes in the future these new men are building and wants to encourage brothers to get involved and show their support. Here, colony members **Joshua Kuhlman '18**, **Giuseppe Di Biase '16**, and **Steven Repas '17** share how they will ensure Theta Delta's successful return.

Q: How is Beta Theta Pi different from other Ohio State fraternities?

Joshua: I think the biggest thing that bothers me is when people use the word "frat." I always correct them and say, "No, I am in a Fraternity, not a frat." I mean it when I say that. Yes, social activities are part of what we do, but being a member of Theta Delta teaches us to have fun in a responsible manner while not compromising our values. Theta Delta and Beta Theta Pi as a whole want us to better ourselves during our time here. They want to see us succeed both as individuals and also as a whole, and that is what makes us different.

Giuseppe: The Men of Principle initiative makes us different from any other Fraternity. It reminds us of our goal: to become gentlemen and leaders living a principled life. This initiative is going to help change the stereotype of Fraternity men.

Steven: We don't just say we have a list of morals and principles, we live them. We do events with class and standards, which is a very lost art in the world today.

How will the new Theta Delta be different from the old Chapter?

Joshua: We are going to last on campus because we are setting a foundation where we stick to our values and remember the meaning of what it is to be a Beta.

Giuseppe: I don't know anybody from the old Chapter, but I believe this Chapter is made of leaders, both on and off campus. We are involved in several organizations that challenge our academic skills and also help the community.

Steven: We have ambition and a very large goal. We strive to be the best in all our endeavors, which was not the mentality of the previous Chapter.

What are your goals for the future of Theta Delta?

Joshua: My goal is to see Theta Delta last. I want this to be an organization that young men are proud to say they are apart of. We will do that through recruitment: attracting men who will be true to our seven core values.

Giuseppe: I would like to set the example for future generations, to create the base of a reputation of responsible and educated men who will be successful, personally and professionally. I would like to see a better reputation for Fraternity men, and hopefully Theta Delta will be a key player in this change.

Steven: I want to put Theta Delta on the national stage. I believe we have the potential to be the best Chapter in Beta Theta Pi, and possibly the NIC.

What would you say to alumni to encourage them about the future of the colony?

Joshua: We are doing good things on campus and we are building a positive culture within Theta Delta. Men are proud to wear their letters around school because we are known as gentlemen, scholars, and men of principal. I encourage alumni to get in touch with us and have lunch, or come to a Chapter meeting. I think they will be surprised about the men in our colony today. We have men who have done internships with NASA, men who have organized humanitarian efforts in Haiti, and men who are training to be leaders in our armed forces, among many other accomplishments.

Giuseppe: This is a group of men with excellent values and life goals. We have accomplished so many things in less than one year together and I can't imagine what we will accomplish in the years to come.

Steven: I was fortunate to be the keynote speaker at the National Convention because of our unique spin on philanthropy. The entire Fraternity was blown away by how well we are doing and they are all rooting for us.

What kind of involvement would you like to see more of from Theta Delta alumni?

Joshua: I would love to see more alumni support. And I don't necessarily mean finically, I mean support what we are doing, support the ideas we have, and support the fact that we are trying to make a change. We have open Chapter meetings, service events, brotherhood events, and would love to see more alumni there. Even if it was just for a cup of coffee, I know we would have 30 guys instantly jump on the chance to just sit and talk.

Giuseppe: I would like to see more brothers at our meetings. Just be there to give us advice

about life or tell stories about when they were in college. We need to build connections with older brothers.

Steven: I would like to see alumni support our philanthropic goals and give us wisdom of how they ran things and how they got to where they are now.

What are you going to do to ensure Theta Delta is sustainable and successful at Ohio State?

Joshua: Recruit the right men. Recruitment is the key to us being sustainable and successful. As long as we keep on recruiting the right men, we will last. As someone who has sat on the recruitment team and has a passion for recruitment, I promise that we are only taking men who we are confident will be an asset to the Chapter.

Giuseppe: Set the example for the younger brothers. I would like to teach the importance of being a gentleman, and show that it is possible to manage the academic and social life at the same time.

Steven: Learn from other chapters about what their mistakes and downfalls were, and try to have the foundation of Theta Delta avoid those pitfalls. We can learn a lot from others' mistakes.
