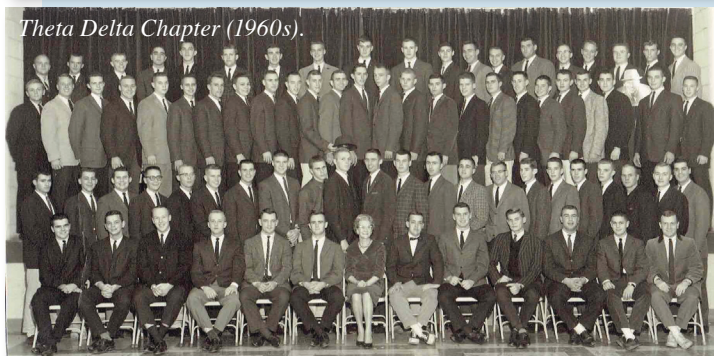
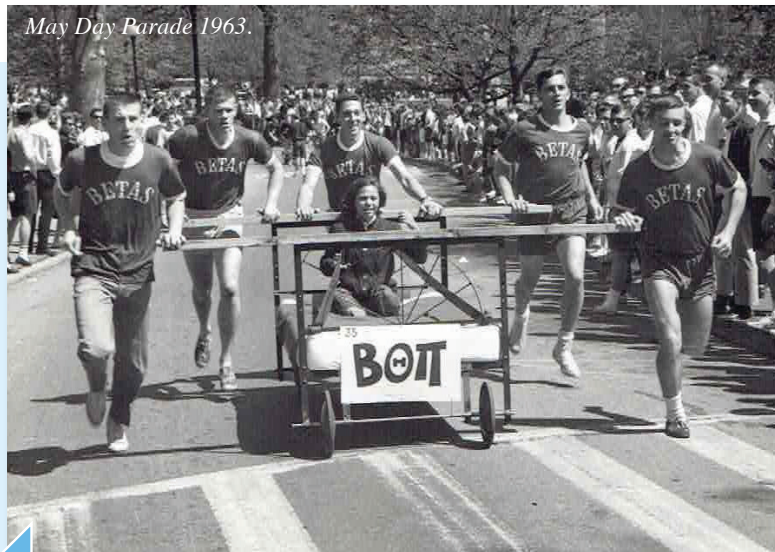
As we look ahead to an exciting fall, we are eager to welcome our newest pledge class and celebrate what is hopefully another national championship season for the Buckeyes.
